

# Script Activities Required Permissions

#### Introduction

This document describes the required permissions to run any of the following script activities.

- Execute Windows Command
- Execute Windows Script
- Execute Windows PowerShell Script

#### Prerequisites

#### Components Used

The information in this document is based on Cisco Process Orchestrator 3.5.1 + Patch 6 or later.

#### Problem

Run any of the script activities (*mentioned above*) locally on Cisco Process Orchestrator server machine results in access denied error.

The script activities can also result in an error that states "failed to execute script: A specified logon session does not exist. It may already have been terminated."

#### Solution

Make sure the Windows User account, used to the run the script has proper permissions. They should be a member of any of the following local user groups.

- Backup Operators
- Power Users
- Administrators

After that check under Local Security Policy -> Local Policies -> Security Options. Make sure the following policy is Disabled: *Network access: Do not allow storage of passwords and credentials for network authentication.*
